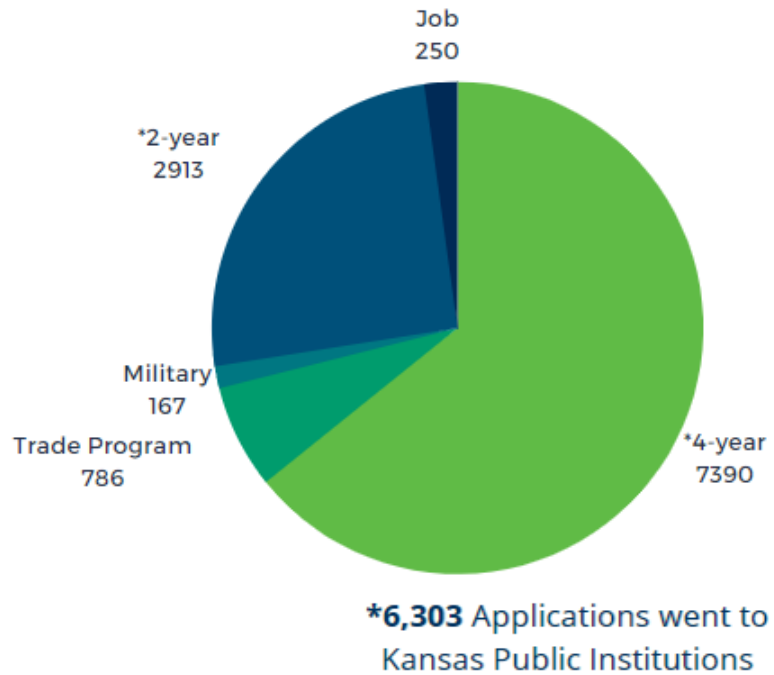

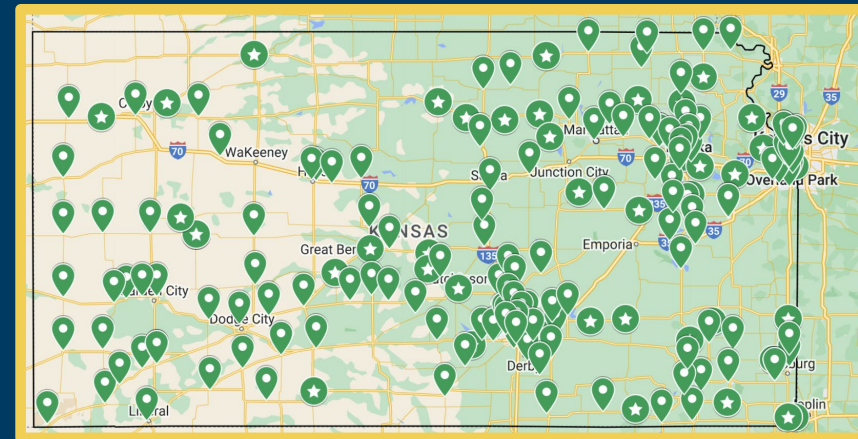

KANSAS FAFSA CHALLENGE



Started in 2021, the Kansas FAFSA Challenge is a statewide FAFSA completion competition among Kansas high schools. Schools will be grouped by size and recognized in two different categories, Highest Completion Rate & Most Improved Completion Rate.

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

The Kansas FAFSA Challenge will be active from October 1, when the FAFSA opens, until June 30 each year. We use senior class size data as reported to KSDE, and the completion numbers for this year and last are reported by FAFSA state-wide data. The winning schools will be announced and recognized annually by both the Kansas Board of Regents and the Kansas State Board of Education at the joint September board meeting.

TRACK YOUR PROGRESS WITH THE KANSAS FAFSA TRACKER

The new Kansas FAFSA Tracker allows schools to see weekly updates of their FAFSA completion percentages. This website shows a calculated FAFSA percentage for every Kansas High School* and creates a leaderboard for Kansas high schools and each KSHSAA division.

(*Schools will only show on the leaderboard if they have at least 1 FAFSA completion for this year. Click the FAFSA state-wide data to see the most recent number of FAFSA completions for your school, if you do not see your school listed)

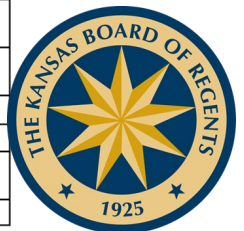

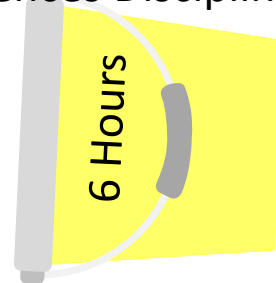
