Pre-Bachelor of Science in Nursing Systemwide Gen Ed and Transfer Associate in Science Degree

The systemwide transfer degree provides a pathway from any Kansas public community college offering the associate degree to any Kansas public university offering the baccalaureate degree. The pathway identifies courses/credit hours taken at the community college level and reflects the Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR) General Education framework "buckets" (<u>https://www.kansasregents.org/academic_affairs/general-education/seven-bucket-framework</u>). The courses will transfer to any public university as the first sixty hours toward the articulated degree. The remaining credit hours at the universities are the required courses to complete the baccalaureate degree.
