



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



General Notes:

1. Definitions of terms in this section can be found in the Glossary.
2. Due to rounding, numbers may not match other published reports.
3. In Fiscal Years 2020 through 2024, the universities received and expended varying amounts of funding for COVID-19 relief. These amounts are primarily reflected as restricted use expenditures.
4. State University student and finance data can also be found in the Kansas Higher Education Statistics (KHEStats). KHEStats is a web-based reporting tool providing access to data about Kansas public postsecondary institutions. KHEStats allows users to view trends, filter reports, and perform comparisons through regularly updated dashboards, graphs, and charts. KHEStats can be accessed at stats.kansasregents.org/.

Table A: Enrollment by Student Characteristics

1. The “% Change” column does not reflect the change in percentage for Student Age: Undergraduates, Student Age: Graduates, and Student Race/Ethnicity, but instead reflects the percent change in the number of students in each category for the time period. These numbers more accurately reflect the change in student population.

Table B: Total Operating Expenditures by Fund

1. The substantial reduction in total expenditures from FY 2022 to FY 2023 is the result of increased Restricted Use expenditures in FY 2022 from federal COVID-19 related funding that was not available in FY 2023. In addition, a decrease in General Fees Fund expenditures is due to a change in funding from the university’s Honors College and Intercollegiate Athletics from FY 2022 to FY 2023. These reductions are partially offset by an increase in State General Fund appropriations for IT infrastructure and cybersecurity projects, an increase in the operating grant, and a 5.0 percent pay plan increase.
2. From FY 2023 to FY 2024, the University reflected State General Fund increases for the Global Center for STEM, the Center for Emerging Technologies, and Student Financial Aid. Increases in restricted use funds reflect a shift of IT Cybersecurity from general use to restricted use.
3. The FY 2024 reported totals for Tables B and C do not match due to an issue between the University’s reported total and amounts from the state accounting system.
4. Most of the increase in expenses from FY 2024 to FY 2025 were from restricted use funds related to the purchase of Block 22. Increases from the State General Fund were primarily from appropriations for Regional Stabilization and Capital Renewal initiatives.

Table C: All Funds Operating Expenditures by Program

1. Expenditures in the “all other” category increased substantially, almost entirely due to increased expenditures from federal COVID-19 relief funds.
2. According to the university, the increase in expenditures from FY 2022 to FY 2023 for Instruction is attributable to overall cost increases, along with a change in funding support for an enhanced academic organization. The increase in Academic Support is one-time funding for IT infrastructure and cybersecurity expenditures, along with an increase in available funding for grants and contracts. The increase in Institutional Support is related to changes in funding support for various University projects. The decrease in Other Expenditures is a result of increased expenditures in FY 2022 from federal COVID-19 related funding which did not continue in FY 2023.
3. The FY 2024 reported totals for Tables B and C do not match due to an issue between the University’s reported total and amounts from the state accounting system.
4. Increases by program from FY 2024 to FY 2025 were in the “other” expenses category and primarily reflected the use of restricted use funds for the purchase of Block 22.

Table D: General Use Operating Expenditures by Program

1. An overall increase in General Use expenditures from FY 2022 to FY 2023 is comprised of increases in Academic Support for IT infrastructure and cybersecurity allocation. The decrease in FY 2023 in expenditures for Student Services and Scholarships & Fellowships is primarily due to elimination of Maintenance of Effort funding and a change in General Use funding for Intercollegiate Athletics. The increase in Other Expenditures is primarily due to costs funded from tuition carryover balances associated with the expansion of McPherson Hall for the School of Nursing.
2. An increase in general use expenditures from FY 2024 to FY 2025 is primarily the result of Regional Stabilization and Capital Renewal initiatives from the Legislature.

Table E: General Use Operating Expenditures by Object

1. Pittsburg State University's "Classified – FTE" and "Classified – Expenditures" are no longer listed separately and now are included in "Unclassified – FTE" and "Unclassified – Expenditures" categories.
2. The increase in FY 2023 General Use expenditures is primarily for Unclassified Salaries because of a 5.0 percent pay plan increase, as well as increases in the cost of benefits. There was also an increase in Utilities due to rising costs.
3. The increase in expenses from FY 2024 to FY 2025 is primarily the result of Regional Stabilization and Capital Renewal initiatives from the Legislature.
